Childcare Resources

The Health Sciences Center is collaborating with entities through Albuquerque to give health care providers and first responder's childcare. All will have their childcare fees, such as registration, enrollment, etc., waived during this pandemic. Tuition may be charged based on the childcare location you choose. Childcare options are available through:

- The City of Albuquerque Community Centers, Pre-Schools and Pre-K sites are free and do not charge fees. Call 505-767-5800 for enrollment opportunities. They can provide childcare services for ages 3 to 10.

Food Assistance

Albuquerque Public Schools is offering free school lunches for school-aged children from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Students, under the age of 18, will receive meals for two days. To find a location of these curbside pick-up meals, visit https://www.aps.edu then click on Grab & Go link.

Residents over the age of 50 can pick up lunches to go from five Senior and Multigenerational Centers from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday through Friday. Call one of the listed centers to reserve and pick up your lunch:

Seniors, over the age of 60, may be eligible to receive meals delivered to your home from Senior Affairs Department. Home bound seniors are given priority. Contact Seniors Affairs at 505-764-6400.

Housing Assistance

Statewide evictions for not being able to pay rent have been temporarily stopped during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) suspends all foreclosure, new and those in process, and evictions for those with financial hardship due to the Coronavirus. This suspension began March 18 and last for 60 days.

Healthcare Services

A drive-thru Coronavirus testing site is now available for healthcare workers, first responders and community members regardless if they are showing symptoms. This site, located in the parking lot of Walmart at 8000 Academy Rd. NE, provides free testing daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. This site is supported by Walmart, Quest Diagnostics and state and local leaders.
