Definitions:

- **Standard Surgical PPE**: Surgical mask, eye protection, fluid resistant gown, sterile gloves, bouffant head cover, hospital-issued scrubs
- **Standard Delivery PPE**: Standard procedure mask, eye protection, fluid resistant gown, sterile gloves, bouffant head cover, hospital-issued scrubs
- **COVID Surgical PPE:** N95, full face shield, fluid resistant gown, sterile gloves, bouffant head cover, hospital-issued scrubs
- **COVID PPE:** N95, eye protection, full face shield, yellow isolation gown, non-sterile gloves, bouffant head cover, hospital-issued scrubs
- Contact + Droplet PPE: Procedure mask, eye protection, bouffant, yellow gown, gloves, hospital-issued scrubs
- Standard PPE: Procedure mask, hospital-issued scrubs, non-sterile gloves (eye protection optional)
- **Standard OR PPE:** Procedure mask, non-sterile gloves, bouffant, hospital-issued scrubs (eye protection or gown optional)

Notes:

- Eye protection includes one of the following: Full face shield, "Tidi" eye shield, or surgical mask with eye shield
- Wear procedure mask over N95 to extend use per extended use/re-use guidelines
- For those who cannot use N95, see PAPR/CAPR/elastomeric mask guidance
- Whenever N95s are used in the OR or delivery room, limit the number of HCP in the room
 - In the delivery room, no more than 5 HCP in addition to the patient and visitor/doula
- Standard precautions make use of common-sense practices and personal protective equipment use that protect healthcare providers from infection and prevent the spread of infection from patient to patient. These measures also include practicing excellent hand hygiene, appropriate PPE use if possible if exposure to infectious material anticipated, respiratory hygiene/cough etiquette, safe injection practices and handling of sharps, appropriate handling, cleaning, and disinfecting of the environment, laundry, etc.
